National Neurodivergent Task Force Parent Carer Workshop January 2025



As part of the Government's response to improving the experience of SEND pupils in mainstream schools they have established a National Neurodivergent Task Force.

The Government has defined the term Neurodivergent as;

'Neurodivergent is a term that describes a group of people whose ways of processing information, behaving, and experiencing their environment differ from the statistical majority.'

The purpose of the Task Force is stated as;

To make recommendations to DfE ministers on the best ways to support and meet the needs of neurodivergent children and young people in mainstream settings.

The group will consider:

- how classroom practices and wider approaches could better meet neurodivergent children and young people's needs
- the presentation of overlapping and co-occurring needs (when different conditions occur together or have similar types of need) and how to support these
- the types of support that should not depend on a diagnosis
- provide a shared understanding about what provision and support should look like, informing classroom practices and wider approaches
- best practice regarding the commissioning of support services across education and health
- how to effectively deliver educational support for neurodivergent children and young people locally, regionally and nationally; and how that support can properly consider long-term ability to be successful and independent in future life as well as short-term support and adjustments

School Nursing

The School Nursing Team provide health and wellbeing information, advice, support and guidance to children and young people, teachers, families, carers and the wider community across Shropshire. We are part of the 0–19 Public Health Nursing Service which contains Specialist Nurses (School Nurses and Health Visitors), Registered Nurses, Healthy Child Practitioners and Support Workers

Every Local Authority funded school in Shropshire has a named School Nurse. We offer a broad range of services, workshops and events enabling schools to contribute to PSHE outcomes, as well as targeted one to one support for children and their families.

We offer support, advice and training for schools around managing health conditions. We undertake universal contacts such as the National Childhood Measurement Programme (NCMP) and Digital Health Assessments for certain cohorts. Data from these contacts provides our Local Authority with rich health profiling data as well as well as offering insight to schools around the

health needs of their students.

For children with EHC plans transferring from:

- early years education to school
- infant to junior school
- primary to middle school
- primary to secondary school
- middle to secondary school

If your child has an Education, Health and Care Plan, and is transferring from:


- Early years to school
- Infant to junior school
- Primary to middle school
- Primary to secondary school
- Middle to secondary school

The deadline for your local authority to review and amend your child's EHCP was 15th February. **This deadline is statutory, not optional.** (For those moving from secondary school to a post-16 institution, the deadline is 31 March)

Providing fire safety education for children and young people in Shropshire




Most children show a natural interest and curiosity with fire. Even if they do not display any fire setting behaviour, many children may be fascinated by fire and it is not uncommon for children as young as two to show an interest. Unfortunately for some children this interest develops into something more dangerous.

Shropshire Fire and Rescue Service offer a free 'Fire setting Intervention Scheme', designed to educate children and young people about the dangers of fire setting.

- The scheme is aimed at:
- children and young people under 17

• who have displayed fire setting behaviour or have played with fire
