Project Overview

Staffordshire & Stoke-on-Trent CCGs and Shropshire, Telford & Wrekin CCG, along with Parent Carer Forums, and Local Authorities for those areas, have been successful in obtaining funding from NHS England for a local Autism in Schools project which will build on the work and learning from the North Cumbria and North East Accelerator Autism in Schools Project (further information available in resources section).

The Partnership has established a multi-agency Leadership Team as the core decision-making group for the pilot and have commissioned project support from the Autism Education Trust. There is also a wider reference group including a range of practitioners from across the pilot area.

4 core elements of the project

A practice-based Learning and Development Programme which seeks to develop a positive school environment for autistic pupils through reasonable adjustments

Developing school-based participation, supported by the established Parent Carer Forums in each local authority area developing a positive partnership between families and schools

Building a new relationship between CAMHS and schools which is focused on developing autism-friendly environments and practice

Hearing from Children and Young People with Autism, and developing self-awareness and confidence

Agreed performance indicators

- Attendance levels for autistic young people and the number of autistic young people on part time timetables
- Permanent and fixed term exclusion levels for autistic young people
- The number of autistic young people who have experienced a school move in the last two years and why
- The percentage of pupils with SEN or EHCP meeting their shortterm targets
- Parent carer satisfaction levels around their relationship with school
- The shared experience of autistic students

Aim of the project

This is a cross system project to improve experience and outcomes for Autistic students in mainstream schools. This will include the development of school workforce and leadership to ensure that mainstream schools offer capable environments in which autistic students can thrive, in particular, supporting good mental health and promoting inclusion for this group of young people. There will also be a focus on ensuring that key transition points for autistic students are supported effectively, ensuring a positive experience in terms of change and moving forward
